WorkSource Youth Center now at Everett Station

November 1, 2010 (Everett, WA) —WorkSource Snohomish County and Workforce Development Council Snohomish County are pleased to announce a Grand Opening for the new WorkSource Youth Center. The event will be held on November 1, 2010 from 10:00 am to 12:00 noon on the second floor of the Everett Train Station at 3201 Smith Ave in Everett.

Snohomish County Executive Aaron Reardon and Youth Center Director Angel Lopez will be cutting the ribbon to officially open the new Resource Center. Tours of the new facility will be given following the ceremony.

“Being located at Everett Station improves our Center’s visibility and usage in the community,” explains Angel Lopez, Director of the WorkSource Youth Center. “In a time when so many adults are unemployed, it’s important that remember the youth in our community who need employment and education resources just as badly in this economy.”

The Youth Center offers teens myriad employment and education resources including a free computer lab, resume assistance, subsidized work experiences, and GED preparation classes. Teens are always welcome to drop in during business hours to use the computer lab to look for work, update their resume, or receive help finding a job.

The grand opening celebrates the relocation of the WorkSource Youth Center to the second floor of Everett station, just below the adult Center. The relocation provides that all County residents—regardless of their age—have access to employment and training resources in one location.
